#### **KEYNOTE SPEAKERS 2023**

### **Professor Trevor Williams**, Economist, visiting professor, lecturer and writer



Trevor Williams is an economist who previously served as Chief Economist at Lloyds Bank for over a decade. From energy and climate to how companies use data, he analyses the key trends and policies that shape markets and brings clarity and cutting edge thinking to the economic overviews.

Prior to his time at Lloyds, Trevor worked for the civil service before going on to work as an economist in the City for over thirty years. He covered specialities including equity and foreign exchange, forecasting and financial analysis. Since, he rotates as the Chair of the Institute of Economic Affairs' Shadow Monetary Policy Committee where he keeps a close eye on the Bank of England's decisions and direction of travel. He considers the impact of interest rates, monetary policy and quantitative easing and translates them into useful intelligence businesses can use to inform strategy. He also reveals how companies can use their own big data sets to reveal insights into their place within the wider economy.

Trevor writes regularly on financial and market matters, including a regular column in the personal finance magazine Moneyfacts. He is the coauthor of Trading Economics, a clear guide to the statistics and indicators that underpin market economics and is a Professor at St Mary's University, London and a Visiting Professor at the University of Derby.

This talk will offer an objective exploration of an economic recovery's nature, likelihood, and timeframe. From pandemics and Brexit to new technologies and business models, Trevor will consider the threats and opportunities in the immediate term and how to respond. He will look at the risks for business and the challenges for policymakers. Are we in for a new 'Roaring 20s' or a global depression, or something in between characterised by a previously unseen combination of employment figures, inflation and interest rates?

#### **KEYNOTE SPEAKERS 2023**

### **Daniel Hulme**, CEO and expert in Artificial Intelligence



Daniel Hulme is the CEO of awardwinning AI solutions company Satalia, Chief AI Officer for WPP, and Director of University College London's Business Analytics Masters degree.

He looks at how AI and emerging technologies, such as the metaverse, can solve the most challenging problems and deals with its business, ethical and social implications, as well as wider technological and economic developments. Passionate about creating a positive technological future, Daniel sees his mission as making AI accessible and understandable whilst also providing a framework for avoiding the potential pitfalls. He works at the intersection of technology, innovation, organisation and ethics.

After studying computer and cognitive science, as well as management and computational complexity, and gaining a doctorate in AI, Daniel has since balanced work in both academia, public and private sectors. He's worked as a consultant for a range of technology companies in the UK and US. He's served on and founded advisory bodies and steering groups largely focused on the economic, employment and ethical implications of technology, data and AI. He's advised the UK Government on data use and worked with groups to foster entrepreneurship. learning and innovation in the private sector. He's also contributed to numerous books, articles and podcasts on AI and the future of work.

Daniel also founded and now leads Satalia. Seen by many as a peer of Google's DeepMind, they apply AI to solving difficult business and social problems. They seek out practical applications of AI, often in unexpected ways, dealing with areas beyond customer and market data or automation. Following Satalia's acquisition by WPP, Dan is now also Chief AI Officer across the WPP Group, looking at the safe and ethical use of AI across WPP, its clients, and wider society.

This session will focus on the reality and the risks of artificial intelligence, busting common myths and offering plenty of time for Q&A.
